

A Short History of Skiing - PART DEUX

For hundreds of years skiing was a means of survival used mostly for transportation and hunting. During the great Northern War, in the early 1700's between Russia, Sweden and Norway, skiing was used for military purposes. Soldiers skied over various terrain all while shooting a gun. The modern biathlon of the Olympics keeps the spirit of these military exercises.

During the 1800's, Norwegians began going to the Alps to ski making it more recreational. In 1868 the cambered ski was invented by Sondre Norheim in Telemark, Norway. This ski featured a side cut and a bow shape. This design distributed the skier's weight more evenly and allowed for carved turns which made turning more precise. Norheim was the first to demonstrate a parallel turn called a Christiana. He is considered the father of telemark skiing which combines elements of both alpine and nordic skiing. Nordic skis do not fix the heel to the binding allowing the skier to propel forward with a walking motion. Alpine skis fix the heel to the binding making walking and climbing more difficult. Future innovations would make alpine skiing more accessible.

Beloit, Wisconsin, was the site of the first documented use of recreational skis in the US in 1841. By this time, skiing was already an organized sport in Norway. By the 1890's, the first laminated skis combined hickory and spruce instead of hardwoods to make a lighter and less expensive ski. As the twentieth century approached, skiing was ready to take off as a well established sport. What improvements, inventions, and world events would fuel this surge in skiing? The history of skiing traces all the way back to ancient times, with rock paintings and sets of skis preserved in bogs dating back to the period between 8000 - 6000 BC.

DuPage River Greenway Bike and Lunch, Sun, 8/4, 9:45am

Come join us for a scenic ride along the DuPage River and beautiful Whalon Lake. We will arrive at 9:45am at DuPage River Greenway parking lot and leave at 10 am promptly. The DuPage River Greenway Trail lot in Bolingbrook, is off Royce Road, 1/2 block west of Route 53 (Lincoln Highway) **before** the small bridge. The trail leads through some nice river scenes, trout ponds, bridges, and beautiful Whalon Lake on the way to Knoch Knolls Nature Center and the convergence of the rivers. If you ride the



whole way, it will be around 13 miles and take roughly 1-3/4 hours. We'll take a few breaks at scenic points along the way like the fen, and the convergence of the East and West Branches of the DuPage River. Bring your bike, helmet, some water, sunscreen, and maybe a snack.

After the ride, let's have lunch and refreshments at Ashford's Restaurant and Bar at Boughton Ridge Golf Course. Located on the south side of Boughton Road (just a little further south on Route 53 from Royce Road and about 1/2 mile east of Rte. 53 on Boughton.)

Revamp: Sat. 8/17, 10am

Update your RSVP pn MeetUp!!!!

Due to the River Closing, the Bill & Ted Retake of the Excellent Kayak Adventure on the Fox River will now be on Saturday 8/17/24. Join us for this Tour which will end at



Yorkville Bicentennial Riverfront Park. Due to the river closing our trip will no longer coincide with the river festival or the Cardboard Regatta (not yet rescheduled). We will,



however, after the ride imbibe at one of the local establishments for dinner and cocktails. This year's Kayak Adventure will run from the Montgomery Dam to the Yorkville Dam. Expect a leisurely and scenic cruise down the Fox River. Don't be surprised if you catch sight of Bald Eagles flying above. Be surprised if you encounter any rapids. The only whitewater on the river is the whitewater course just past our takeout point at Yorkville. Expect the adventure to

last 4-5 hours. Meet at 10am at the Yorkville Dam at Bicentennial Riverfront Park in Yorkville (the trip endpoint). From there, we will coordinate shuttling everyone to the start point at Montgomery Dam. Plan to put in just below the Dam at South Broadway Park in Montgomery. Our lunch stop will be at Hudson Crossing Park in Oswego. Paddlers must supply their own food, water, and other beverages for the entire journey. Both porta-potties and potable water are available at the lunch stop. There are no Porta-potties at the the launch point, so take care of business before hand! We will take out just above the Yorkville Dam at Bicentennial Riverfront Park, Yorkville.

The Yak Shack has 15 Kayaks reserved for Piccadilly and some canoes. If you reserved for the previous date of 7/20, your reservation carries over. We need to know if you can still attend, or if we can release your kayak for someone else. To that end, please update your RSVP on MeetUp ASAP.

If you did not have a kayak or canoe reserved before, you must call Jeff at the Yak Shack at (630)

479-8074 to make your reservation for Saturday August 17th and tell them you are with "Piccadilly Ski Club" to get the bargain rate of \$35 for single person Kayaks and/or \$50 for two-person canoes. Each attending member will be responsible for reserving and paying for their own rental through the Yak Shack. The rental will include Lifejackets, Paddles, delivery and pickup of the Water Craft (we will be transporting the paddlers). Palos Preserves, Cook County

Tucked away in the Palos Preserves in southwestern Cook County, **Cranberry Slough Nature Preserve** was only the <u>fifth nature preserve in Illinois</u> when it was dedicated in 1965. Distinguished by its peat bog ecosystem cradled by rolling upland woods, the site is a relic of the glacial era and supports habitats uncommon this far south. This hike will start in the

parking lot (at the east end of the lot near the loop) and continue in a circle around the bog and historical trail for about 2 ½ miles. After the hike, we will "mosey" on over to Mo's Willow Pub for lunch. By then we will be thirsty and hungry. Getting to Cranberry Slough: Take Rte 83 south from Willowbrook to Archer 171 east (left) to 95th St south (right) past Maple Lake to Country Lane Woods parking lot to the loop end where we meet.
