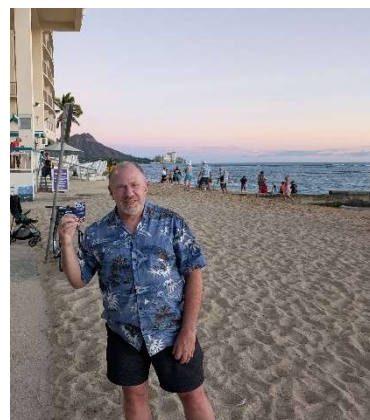

The 'bee' in 'ski bee' is an alteration of an English dialect word that meant “voluntary help given by neighbors toward the accomplishment of a particular task,” → Surviving and then craving a thrilling trip down a mountain covered with snow and ice (aka Skiing). The PSC founders also wanted to capture that sense of community by encouraging others to enjoy the sport of SKIING.

But as much as we love skiing and sewing, bees are also important to us. 😊

Yes, you read that right, PSC will be going to the heart of Kentucky Bourbon Country in Louisville next year, May 12-16, 2025. This will be a drive-yourself-down and back trip and we will be staying 4 nights at the Springhill Suites Hotel on Jefferson Street right in downtown Louisville. There are quite a few distilleries (and breweries) within a convenient short walk

from this hotel. This trip also includes a dinner cruise on the Belle of Louisville Riverboat which comes with a buffet dinner, coffee, lemonade and water, and cash bar. We are also including an all-day bus tour to 2 or 3 distilleries, a lunch stop (lunch is not included) and a tour of Churchill Downs!



Not enough bourbon? Not to worry – there is an **optional** second all-day bus tour to 2 or 3

more distilleries and a lunch stop (lunch is not included). The cost of this **optional** second bus tour

will depend upon how many people wish to go on it. Too much bourbon?? No worries – the Louisville Slugger Museum and Factory is a short walk from the hotel 😊 There are plenty of non-bourbon activities too! The Springhill Suites hotel includes a full hot American buffet breakfast daily, in-room microwave and mini-fridge, and reduced parking of \$10/car/night.

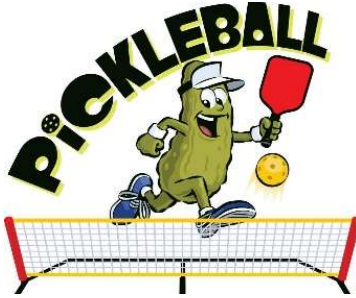

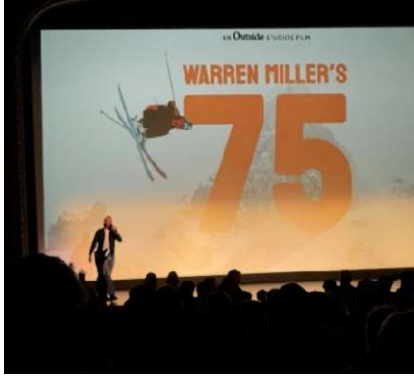
pace hike.
